The Game: The three-time defending Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) champion Hampton University hosts the Wildcats of New Hampshire on Saturday, Nov. 25 in the first round of the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. The Pirates earned the MEAC's automatic berth as the conference champion, while UNH received an at-large bid.



This is the third consecutive trip to the playoffs for the Pirates and 15-year head coach Joe Taylor, and their fifth appearance since moving up to Division I in 1995. Saturday's game will also mark the second straight year that Hampton will host a playoff game at Armstrong Stadium after taking on another Atlantic-10 opponent in Richmond last season.

Currently ranked No. 9 in The Sports Network Top 25 Poll, the Pirates enter their matchup with UNH with an overall mark of 10-1 and riding a three-game winning streak following their Oct. 21 loss at South Carolina State.

The Wildcats come into the game at 8-3 overall, 5-3 in the A-10 after closing out the regular season with an overtime win at 22nd ranked Maine.

Series History: This will be the third meeting between the Pirates and the Wildcats with UNH holding a 2-0 advantage in the series. The Pirates opened the season against the Wildcats at home in 2000 falling 31-17, and at UNH in 2001 where they lost a 45-29 decision.

The Coaches: Joe Taylor is entering his 15th season at the helm of the Pirate program and his 24th season overall as a head coach. He is Hampton's all-time winningest coach with a record of 130-43-1, guiding the Pirates to eight conference championships (5 MEAC, 3 CIAA),

four SBN Black College National Championships and seven playoff appearances. With 191 career victories, head coach Joe Taylor is third on the list of winningest active coaches in Division I-AA. His .714 winning percentage is fifth among active coaches as well.

The Wildcats are led by eight-year head coach Sean McDonnell, the reigning Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year as selected by The Sports Network. He owns a record of 52-40 at UNH, going 28-8 in the last three years, including a mark of 17-6 against Atlantic 10 opponents.

Hampton Playoff History: In earning the MEAC's automatic bid the Pirates will be making their fifth trip to the Division I playoffs and their second time as the home team. Hampton has an all-time record of 0-4 in the postseason. Last year the Pirates faced the A-10 co-champion Richmond in the first round, falling 38-10 at Armstrong Stadium. As a whole, the MEAC has an all-time playoff record of 8-19 (.296).

1997 Playoffs: Youngstown State - 28, Hampton - 13

Hampton's first I-AA playoff appearance got off to a rough start as Youngstown State, led by current Ohio State coach Jim Tressell, scored 14 points off of two Pirate turnovers and took a 21-0 lead into the half. The Pirates found themselves down 28-0 before getting on the board in the third quarter on an 8-yard run by quarterback Roy Johnson. Charles Jackson added a 13-yard run to trim the Penguin lead to 28-13. Hampton racked up 357 yards of total offense to 290 for Youngstown State, but the Pirates turned the ball over six times (4 fumbles, 2 int.) to seal their own fate. Jackson rushed for 98 yards and a score for the Pirates, while Johnson completed 13-of-26 passes for 152 yards. Deon Hunt's 11 tackles led the defensive effort for Hampton.

1998 Playoffs: UCONN - 42, Hampton - 34

This playoff matchup turned into a shootout as both teams put up more than 400 yards of total offense. The Pirates pounded out 227 yards on the ground, led by Montrell Coley's 87 yards and two touchdowns, including a 40-yard run to open the scoring. The Huskies primarily used an air attack as quarterback Shane Stafford threw for 294 yards and four touchdowns to four different receivers. Down 21-17 at the half, Hampton rallied to tie the game at 28 on a 2-yard run by Mike Jones with 12:04 remaining in the fourth quarter. However, UCONN answered with 14 straight points to escape with the victory.

2004 Playoffs: William & Mary 42, Hampton 35

Led by senior wide receiver Jerome Mathis, the Hampton University Pirates put forth a valiant effort before coming up just short of their first Division I-AA playoff win, falling 42-35 to William & Mary. Mathis' HU playoff record 394 all-purpose yards were countered by Lang Campbell's 294 passing yards and three touchdowns for The Tribe.

The Pirates jumped out to a 13-0 first quarter lead on a 1-yard run by Ardell Daniels and an 80-yard touchdown strike from Princeton Shepherd to Mathis. However, the Tribe responded with an 8-play, 80-yard drive to make the score 13-7 at the half.

Atlantic 10 Player of the Year Lang Campbell and the Tribe offense exploded for 35 points in the second half, 21 in the fourth quarter to escape with the 42-35 victory.

Shepherd's 242 yards passing and two touchdowns were a Hampton playoff record, as were Mathis' six receptions, 188 receiving yards, three touchdowns, 80-yard touchdown reception, 93-yard kickoff return and 394 all-purpose yards.

2005 Playoffs: Richmond 38, Hampton 10

The University of Richmond scored 28 unanswered points in the second half, breaking open a 10-10 halftime tie and cruising to a 38-10 victory over No. 2 Hampton. The loss ended the Pirates' 11-game winning streak and 12-game winning streak at Armstrong Stadium.

Richmond took an early 7-0 first quarter lead on a touchdown run by quarterback Stacy Tutt, but the Pirates responded with 10 points in the second on a 44-yard field goal by Andrew Paterini and a 7-yard TD reception by Onrea Jones.

Tutt and the Spiders' ground game took over in the second half, as the senior QB rushed four straight times for 48 yards to set up a 3-yard plunge by Tim Hightower that gave Richmond the lead for good at 17-10.

The Pirates failed to field the kickoff and the Spiders recovered on the Hampton 37-yard line and eventually punched it in for a 24-10 advantage. Richmond went on to add two fourth quarter touchdowns to provide the final 38-10 margin.

HU backup quarterback Antwan Smith set a Pirate playoff record with 15 completions (221 yards, 1 TD, as did Onrea Jones' 11 catches and 192 receiving yards.

Hampton vs. Atlantic 10: Since moving to Division I in 1995 the Pirates have had their share of problems against opponents from the A-10. Hampton is just 1-8 versus the league with the only victory coming at James Madison in the 2002 season opener.

10-Win Seasons: At 10-1 this year the Pirates turned in their seventh 10-win season in 104 years of football. Coach Taylor has produced six 10-win seasons thus far, including a school record 12 victories in 1993.

Home Sweet Home: The Pirates are hoping that their home field advantage will help them get over their four-game skid in the Division I playoffs. Since the 2002 season Hampton is 23-3 (.884) when playing at Armstrong Stadium, posting a 12-game winning streak at one point before suffering a loss to Richmond in last year's playoff. Hampton went 5-0 at home this year, averaging better than 36 points per game, while surrendering just 11 points per outing.

Quick Strike Potential: Under new offensive coordinator Chris Beatty the Hampton offense has shown that it is capable of scoring quickly and from anywhere on the field. The Pirates have had 58 scoring drives on the year and 42 (72%) of them have taken less than four minutes off the clock. In fact, 21 have taken less than two minutes and five times the Pirates scored on the first play of a drive. This quick strike potential has led to the Pirates averaging more than 33 points per game, sixth in the NCAA.

Explosive Plays: Led by Alonzo Coleman's 13, the Pirates have had 43 plays this season that went for 20 or more yards, 23 coming through the air and 20 on the ground. Marquay McDaniel ranks second with 12 20-yard receptions. All in all eight players have accounted

HU Defense Poised For Test: The Hampton defense has been ranked among the nation's best in several statistical categories this season, but Saturday's game may be their most difficult test to date. The Pirates lead the country in pass defense, surrendering just over 119 yards per game and allowing opponents to complete just 45 % of their passes, while also ranking fifth in interceptions with 15. In addition, Hampton allows just 12.1 points (4th in NCAA) and 258 total yards (10th in NCAA) per game. However, the Pirates will face a formidable foe in the form of the UNH offense led by quarterback Ricky Santos. The Wildcats are seventh in total offense and 11th in passing offense at 250 yards per game. And while the HU defense has surrendered just 10 touchdown passes on the year, six in the last 10 games, Santos is completing passes at a 68 % clip and has 23 scoring tosses.

Pirates Looking To Improve Rushing Game: Coach Joe Taylor and the Pirates must improve upon their rushing statistics from the past two playoff appearances if they're to have success against the Wildcats. Despite having two 1,000-yard rushers in each of the last two seasons, Hampton averaged just 114 yards per game and 2.8 yards per carry in playoff losses to William & Mary and Richmond. However, the Pirates may be able to capitalize on a Wildcat defense that ranks eighth in the Atlantic 10 against the run, allowing 153 yards per game.

HU Block Party: After blocking three kicks in the season opener against Grambling State, the Pirates' special teams came through again with three more versus Bethune-Cookman. In fact, since the 2003 season the Pirates have blocked a total of 29 field goals, extra points and punts. After blocking nine kicks in 2003, the Pirates registered six and five in the following two seasons and this year they have nine. Calvin Bannister leads Hampton with seven blocks during this span and Kendall Langford ranks second with four.

Streak Ends At 33 For HU Defense: By failing to produce a turnover in the loss at S.C. State on Oct. 21, the Pirate defense had its streak of consecutive games having forced a turnover snapped. Hampton had forced its opponents into at least one turnover in 33 consecutive games. However, forcing eight turnovers in the last three games has the Pirates back on track, making it 36 out of the last 37 games that the defense has forced a turnover.

Points Off Turnovers: The Pirates have made a habit of scoring points off turnovers thus far in the 2006 season. Hampton has converted 28 turnovers (including TO on downs) into 112 points, all coming on Pirate touchdowns. The HU offense has been able to produce points at a 57% (16-of-28) clip after gaining possession from an opponent turnover.

Now That's Efficient: The Pirates have managed to put up points in 40 of the 44 quarters played this season, while holding their opposition scoreless in 27 quarters.

257 And Counting: With 257 consecutive games without being shutout, Hampton currently leads I-AA in that category. The last time the Pirates were held scoreless was back on Sept. 1, 1984 when they fell to Tennessee State 44-0 in the season opener.

Kick Return Game Tops In I-AA: The Pirates' kickoff and punt returners have routinely been among the best in the country over the past several years, and this season appears to be no different. As a team Hampton is fourth in kickoff returns, while sophomore Kevin Teel currently ranks second the nation in with an average of 32.41 yards, including a 92-yard touchdown to open the second half at Delaware State.

Pirate Defense Among Leaders In Tackle For Loss: The Pirate defense is tied for first in the country with Harvard in tackles for loss with 93.5 for an average of 8.5 per game. Leading the way is the duo of Justin Durant (12 TFL) and Kendall Langford (13.5 TFL).

Coleman New MEAC Record Holder: Alonzo Coleman ran for 91 yards on just 10 carries in the win over Winston-Salem State to become the MEAC's all-time leading rusher surpassing former Howard standout Harvey Reed (4,142). Coleman, who now has 4,505 yards, also holds the conference record for touchdowns (63) and points scored (378).

Coleman 91 Yards Shy Of History: Despite being limited to just 137 rushing attempts due to several injuries this season, senior running back Alonzo Coleman enters Saturday's game needing just 91 yards to join an elite group of running backs. If he can manage that against the Wildcats he will become just the sixth player in I-AA history to have four consecutive 1,000-yard seasons. Harvard's Clifton Dawson and UMASS' Steve Baylark are the most recent additions to that list with both of them reaching that milestone this season.

Beverly's Sets New Mark Against Aggies: Kevin Beverly's 204 yards rushing and four touchdowns against North Carolina A&T both established a new marks at Hampton for a player making his first career start. In addition, his four touchdown performance is also tied for the MEAC lead in points in a single game this season with 24. With Alonzo Coleman slowed by injury this season Beverly has shown that he is more than capable of handling the load. He is tied with Coleman with 11 rushing touchdowns and has 712 yards rushing and a 5.6 yards per carry average.

Shepherd Thriving Under New Offense: Despite having to adjust to a new offensive scheme, quarterback Princeton Shepherd has shown that he is indeed capable of being a drop back passer and keeping opposing defenses from keying on running back Alonzo Coleman. He has completed 126-of-190 passes for 1,564 yards and 15 touchdowns, surpassing his touchdown total from 2005. In addition, he ranks eighth in passing efficiency (157.3) and has completed 66% of his attempts. Against Norfolk State Shepherd threw for a career-high four touchdowns to lead Hampton to a 42-13 victory.

Shepherd 70 Yards Shy Of 5,000: Senior Princeton Shepherd is back for his third season as the starting quarterback and the win over Florida A&M helped him join Matt Montgomery (1991-94) as the only Hampton signal caller to guide the Pirates to three consecutive conference titles. Shepherd has a remarkable record of 30-6 (.833) as a starter, with four of those losses coming by a combined 25 points, and he has tossed at least one touchdown pass in 26 of those 36 games. With 4,930 yards passing for his career, Shepherd now sits in third place on the Pirates' all-time list. Shepherd is also third in total offense (5,311), third in pass completions (342) and third in touchdown passes (46).

Hitting His Mark: With his 66.3 completion percentage, Princeton Shepherd is on pace to break the Hampton single-season mark currently held by Roy Johnson who connected on 59.9% (148-of-247) of his attempts in 1999. Shepherd, whose previous season-high completion percentage was 56.7, has connected on over 70% of his throws in four of his 10 games this season. In the remaining six contests he was still over 60% five times. In addition, his conference-leading 15 touchdown passes average out to one per 8.4 pass completions, or one per 12.6 pass attempts.

Making His Mark: In his final campaign with the Pirates, Marquay McDaniel is making sure that his name will remain in the Hampton record books for some time. With 53 receptions for 727 yards and 12 touchdowns, he has moved into the top six in three career receiving categories. McDaniel ranks third in career receptions (145), tied for third in receiving touchdowns (20) and fifth in receiving yards (1,970). In addition, his 12 touchdown receptions this season are also a school single-season record and he is just 30 yards shy of 2,000 receiving yards for his career.

McDaniel Making History Of His Own: While running back Alonzo Coleman has garnered much of the attention for his record setting efforts, Marquay McDaniel has quietly become I-AA's all-time leader in punt returns. McDaniel entered the season ranked No. 1 in career punt return yards and he continues to add to his total which now stands at 1,890. In addition, with 142 career returns he is just two shy of overtaking former Montana return man Levander Segars (143) for the all-time lead in that category as well.

Keeping Up With Jones: With his four receptions for 78 yards against Florida A&M, senior wide receiver Onrea Jones extended his streak of games having at least one reception to 22. The last time Jones went without a reception was against Jackson State in the 2005 season opener.

Durant Listed As Top 5 LB By Mel Kiper: The two-time MEAC Defensive Player of the Year Justin Durant has caught the eye of NFL draft guru Mel Kiper. Prior to the season Kiper rated his top five seniors at each position and Durant is ranked No. 4 at inside linebacker and he also has the distinction of being the only Division I-AA player among the 80 seniors listed.

Durant Climbs To Second All-Time In Total Tackles: With 339 total tackles for his career (176 solo), linebacker Justin Durant has moved into second place all-time at Hampton behind only Gareth Bonds (389) His 176 solo stops rank third.
