

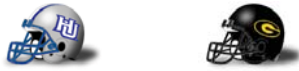

The Game: The 13th ranked Pirates of Hampton University kickoff the 2006 season against the 23rd ranked Tigers of Grambling State in the Ford MEAC-SWAC Challenge. This matchup features two of the most storied programs in black college football and the co-champions in last season's Sheridan Broadcasting Network (SBN) Black College Football Poll. Back-to-back champions of the MEAC, the Pirates return 47 lettermen, including seven starters on a defense that finished second in I-AA in points allowed last season at a mere 14 points per game. Hampton also boasts the MEAC's reigning Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year in running back Alonzo Coleman and linebacker Justin Durant.



Grambling State captured the 2005 SWAC championship on the arm of the departed Bruce Eugene who shattered school, conference and NCAA records throughout his career. The Tigers matched Hampton's 11-1 record in 2005 and they return 45 lettermen and 14 starters from that squad.

Series History: The Ford MEAC-SWAC Challenge will mark the eighth time the Pirates and the Tigers will square off on the gridiron, with Hampton holding a 5-2 advantage in the series. Oddly enough, all seven previous meetings were also played on neutral ground in the New York Urban League Classic at Giants Stadium. Hampton lost the initial meeting 22-3 in 1990, but the Pirates have won the last four contests.

Last Meeting: Hampton 27, Grambling State 7, Giants Stadium, Sept. 25, 1999
 Montrell Coley's rushing attack and the Pirate defense guided Hampton to a 27-7 victory over Grambling State in front of more than 41,000 fans at the 1999 New York Urban League Classic. Led by Coley's 145 yards rushing and Roy Johnson's 168 passing yards, the Pirates amassed 447 yards of total offense and held the ball for nearly 37 minutes. Deon Hunt and Curtis Blackwell registered eight tackles apiece as the Hampton defense sacked Tiger

quarterbacks five times. Grambling State managed only 226 total yards, including just 40 yards rushing on 26 attempts.

Next Week: The Pirates return to Armstrong Stadium next week as they host rival Howard in the Battle For The Real HU. Game time is set for 6 p.m. and the game will be broadcast on tape delay at 10 p.m. on ESPNU. Hampton has won the past nine meetings against the Bison, including a 22-12 decision last year.

The Coaches: Joe Taylor is entering his 15th season at the helm of the Pirate program and his 24th season overall as a head coach. He is Hampton's all-time winningest coach with a record of 120-42-1, guiding the Pirates to seven conference championships (4 MEAC, 3 CIAA), four SBN Black College National Championships and six playoff appearances.

Melvin Spears is in his third year at Grambling State and has compiled a mark of 17-6 after leading the Tigers to an 11-1 record and a SWAC championship in 2005.

Taylor Fourth Winningest Active Coach: With 181 career victories, head coach Joe Taylor ranks fourth on the list of winningest active coaches in Division I-AA. His .707 winning percentage is fourth among active coaches as well.

Season Openers: Since beginning football in 1902 Hampton has a record of 68-32-3 in season openers, including a 10-4 mark under Coach Taylor.

HU Versus The SWAC: Hampton has an all-time record of 10-7 against teams currently in the Southwestern Athletic Conference. The Pirates' last contest against a SWAC opponent came in last season's opener when they defeated Jackson State 20-7 in the Detroit Classic at Ford Field.

HU Dominates Preseason All-MEAC Honors: When the preseason all-conference team was announced the Pirates not only landed a league-high nine players on it, but they also swept Player of the Year honors. Senior running back Alonzo Coleman was named the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year for the third consecutive season to lead five Pirates on the offensive side of the ball. The 2004 and 2005 MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, senior linebacker Justin Durant was again tabbed to walk away with the league's top defensive honor in 2006.

Pirates Picked To Repeat: The reigning Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) champion Hampton University was picked to capture its third consecutive conference title according to the media and coaches polls released at the MEAC Football Press Luncheon in Virginia Beach. In addition, the Pirates swept the Preseason Player of the Year honors and landed nine players on the Preseason All-MEAC Football Team.

The Pirates received 10 of 16 possible first place votes in the media poll and six of nine votes in the coaches poll. South Carolina State was predicted to finish second in both polls, while Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M were predicted to place third in the media and coaches polls respectively.

In The Polls: For the second year in a row Hampton opens the season ranked No. 1 in the SBN Sports Black College Football Poll and No. 13 in The Sports Network Poll. Last season the Pirates posted a perfect 11-0 record in the regular season, climbing as high as No. 2 in The Sports Network Poll heading into the I-AA playoffs.

Taylor In September: The Pirates are 45-9-1 in the month of September under Coach Taylor, including a mark of 11-0 in the last three years.

10 Wins: With an 11-1 record in 2005 the Pirates turned in their sixth 10-win season in 103 years of football at Hampton. Coach Taylor has produced five of those 10-win seasons, including a school record 12 victories in 1993.

Pirates Made For TV: The Ford MEAC-SWAC Challenge will be the first of five Hampton football games that will be carried on ESPN's family of networks. In addition to the season opener which will air on ESPN2, the Pirates will also appear on ESPNU in games against Howard, Norfolk State, South Carolina State and Bethune-Cookman.

2006 Leadership Committee: Getting away from the normal practice of selecting team captains, the Pirates have instead implemented a Leadership Committee for the third straight season. The committee of 10 is charged with acting as spokesmen for the team and handling situations related to team policies, academic affairs and other topics. Pirate Defense Looking To Repeat 2005 Performance: With seven starters returning to a defense that was among the best in the country a year ago, the Pirates expect to mirror their 2005 performance.

Offense To Open Things Up: Although the Pirates averaged better than 31 points per game in 2005, head coach Joe Taylor still made a change in offensive coordinators, bringing in highly touted Landstown High School (Virginia Beach, Va.) coach Chris Beatty and his spread offense. Under Beatty Landstown posted a mark of 40-2, making three consecutive appearances in the Virginia AAA championship game, winning a state title in 2004. And while the Pirates have the reigning Offensive Player of the Year in running back Alonzo Coleman, Hampton has made the transition from running to set up the pass, to passing to set up the run. Multiple wide receiver sets and pre-snap movement are just two of the components of Beatty's spread offense that will force opponents to cover sideline-to-sideline.

Unfamiliar Territory: When Richmond's Stacy Tutt ran in from one yard out with 2:58 to play in the first quarter of last year's first round playoff game, the Pirates found themselves in unfamiliar territory... playing from behind. Out of the 720 minutes played last season, Hampton trailed for just 98 minutes and one second or 13% of the time.

HU Defense Continues Streak: With two interceptions and a fumble recovery in their final game against Richmond last season, the Pirates extended their streak of consecutive games having forced a turnover. Hampton has forced its opponents into at least one turnover in each of the last 26 games. The last time the HU defense went without forcing a turnover was back on Nov. 8, 2003 at Bethune-Cookman.

Closing Out The Half: One reason the Pirates were successful in 2005 was their ability to close out both halves in great fashion as they outscored opponents 223-79 in the second and

Coleman and Durant Up For National Awards: Hampton linebacker Justin Durant has been tabbed by The Sports Network as one of the leading 16 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually to the top defensive player in Division I-AA, while his teammate Alonzo Coleman is among the leading candidates for the Payton Award which goes to the best player on the offensive side of the ball.

Record Watch: Alonzo Coleman enters the 2006 season with several school and conference records within his grasp. With 3,596 career rushing yards he needs just 243 to surpass Montrell Coley (3,838) and become Hampton's all-time leader, while 547 more yards would make him the MEAC's top ground gainer ever. In addition, with 52 career touchdowns (50 rushing) he needs just two more to overtake Coley in that category as well. Another 1,000-yard season in 2006 and Coleman will become just the eighth Division I player to rush for more than 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons.

Coleman and Daniels Made History In 2005: The running back tandem of Alonzo Coleman and Ardell Daniels ran for 1,326 and 1,044 yards respectively in 2005 to become just the third pair of backs to each rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons, after the duo also did it in 2004. After splitting time and carries for the past three years, Coleman is finally the focal point of the Pirates' ground game which should allow for him to add to his school record 20 100-yard games.

Coleman And McDaniel Tops Among Active I-AA Players: Alonzo Coleman's 52 total touchdowns and his 50 rushing touchdowns rank first among active players in Division I-AA, while his 3,596 rushing yards rank second behind Harvard's Clifton Dawson's 3,628 yards. Fellow Pirate senior Marquay McDaniel also leads all active players with 116 punt returns and 1,668 punt return yards. His 14.4 yard return average ranks third.

Shepherd Back Under Center: Senior Princeton Shepherd is back for his third season as the starting quarterback and he's looking to join Matt Montgomery (1991-94) as the only Hampton signal caller to guide the Pirates to three consecutive conference titles. Shepherd has a remarkable record of 21-5 as a starter, with four of those losses coming by a combined 25 points, and he has tossed at least one touchdown pass in 19 of those 26 games. With 3,366 yards passing for his career, Shepherd should overtake Tim Frazier (4,035) for third place on the Pirates' all-time passing list by season's end. Shepherd is also currently fifth all-time in pass completions (216), fourth in touchdown passes (31) and sixth in total offense (3,588).

New Faces Up Front: If there is one area of concern for Hampton it would have to be the offensive line where three Pirates are poised to make their first career start. Center Terrance Smith and guards Akeem Lamar and Dennis Conley have never started a game at their current positions. Junior college transfer Adam Herald was expected to be a starter at one of the guard positions but he suffered a broken fibula during the first week of practice. Lamar spent all of camp at defensive nose tackle, but made the switch on Monday. Veterans Nevin McCaskill and Brandon Walker will be called upon to anchor the line early on. McCaskill is a three-year starter who has manned the left tackle position for 28 straight contests, while Walker started all 12 games at right tackle a year ago.

Sports Network Positional Rankings: HU linebacker Justin Durant was ranked as the second best linebacker in the country according to a preseason poll distributed by The Sports Network. Defensive end Kendall Langford and cornerback Travarous Bain were ranked third and seventh at their positions respectively. On the offensive side of the ball Alonzo Coleman was tabbed as the seventh best running back and placekicker Andrew Paterini ranked fourth.

Durant Fourth All-Time In Total Tackles: Senior Justin Durant has 255 total tackles to his credit, placing him fourth among Hampton's all-time leaders in that category. His 124 tackles in 2005 were the fourth best total in a season by any Pirate defender and another stellar season should see him climb as high as No. 2. Gareth Bonds (1989-92) is Hampton's career leader with 389 tackles, followed by James Chapman (1987-90) who as 332.

Paterini Footing The Bill: After a breakout season in 2004, Andrew Paterini came back last season to shatter all of his own records and establish himself as the Pirates' best placekicker ever. The Sports Network and American Football Coaches Association All-American led Division I-AA with 20 field goals made in 2005, ranking third in field goals made per game with 1.67. He finished 16th in the country in scoring with 104 points (8.67 ppg) and became HU's all-time leader in field goals made (43) and extra points made (136). Paterini set a school record and tied the MEAC mark with his 55-yard field goal in the Pirates' win at Norfolk State.

Missing Muro: With the departure of punter Cameron Muro, freshman Jahmal Blanchard will have to step in and give the Pirates a solid effort in the kicking game. However, replacing Muro will not be an easy task. He finished his career as the Pirates' leader in career average at 42 yards per punt, earning all-american and all-conference honors along the way. Yet if there is anyone capable of stepping in and making an immediate impact, it would have to be Blanchard who averaged 47 yards per punt during his final season at Blanche Ely High School in Ft. Lauderdale.

Links To Landstown: The hiring of new offensive coordinator Chris Beatty also brought along some players with ties to Beatty and his Landstown High School program. West Virginia transfer TJ Mitchell and Virginia Tech transfer Jeremy Gilchrist are the two most noted additions to the Pirates' roster. Mitchell passed for a state record 46 touchdowns as a senior in 2003 before attending Hargrave Military Academy in 2004 and redshirting at WVU in 2005. Gilchrist was on the receiving end of many of Mitchell's passes at Landstown, departing as the second ranked receiver in Virginia High School League history in terms of receptions and receiving yards. In 2005 at Virginia Tech Gilchrist had one 9-yard reception and a 14-yard run.

Old Faces In New Places: Several veterans are back but in different positions this season on both sides of the ball. Offensively, Antwan Smith who came into camp as the No. 2 quarterback has been moved to wide receiver. West Virginia transfer TJ Mitchell will now backup Princeton Shepherd. On defense, former defensive backs Henti Baird and Ray Lewis have moved down to linebacker. Both bring big hit abilities and Baird adds great athleticism which he displayed during preseason testing with a school record 41 inch vertical jump. Akeem Lamar has also made the switch from offensive line to defensive tackle where he should see plenty of action.

From Walk-On To Starter: Senior Jermaine Mallory is a testament to the fact that hard work and perseverance do pay off. After spending his first three seasons as a walk-on limited primarily to special teams duty, Mallory earned himself a scholarship and a starting spot at strong safety with his superb play during spring and preseason camp. His work off the field has been recognized as well. As an architecture major he completed an assignment to design a house and the Hampton Housing Authority liked it so much that they are making plans to actually build it based on his design.
