Today's Game: For the 14th consecutive year, the Pirates of Hampton University travel to Giants Stadium to participate in the New York Urban League Classic. Hampton made its initial appearance in 1990 falling to Grambling State 22-3 and the Pirates returned in 1993 and have been a mainstay ever since. Hampton has compiled an overall record of 11-3 in the classic.

The 11th ranked Pirates enter the game looking to reach a historical milestone with their 500th victory in 105 years of football at the University. A win over the Bears and the Pirates will join a list that includes 27 other Division I-AA programs, including two historically black colleges in Southern (514) and Florida A&M (513). In addition, a victory would also extend Hampton's regular season winning streak to 21 games heading into next week's game at Delaware State. The Hornets were the last team to defeat the Pirates in regular season play with a 28-23 win back on Oct. 2, 2004.

The Bears of Morgan State are coming off of their first victory of the season with a 28-20 win over Bowie State last Saturday. Chad Simpson ran for 178 yards and three touchdowns to help the Bears rally from a 13-point deficit and improve to 1-2 on the season.

Series History: This will be the 55th meeting between the Pirates and the Bears with Morgan State leading the series 34-18-2. One of Hampton's oldest rivalries, this matchup dates back to 1922 when the Pirates won the first meeting 6-0. Hampton went on to win the next three games as well before the 1933 battle ended in a 6-6 tie. Following that the Bears rebounded to win the next seven meetings. Under the direction of Coach Taylor the Pirates have dominated the series by winning nine of the 11 games.

The Coaches: Joe Taylor is entering his 15th season at the helm of the Pirate program and his 24th season overall as a head coach. He is Hampton's all-time winningest coach with a record of 123-42-1, guiding the Pirates to seven conference championships (4 MEAC, 3 CIAA), four SBN Black College National Championships and six playoff appearances. Donald Hill-Eley is in his fifth season at the helm of the Morgan State football program. He has compiled an overall record of 21-27, 1-3 versus Hampton. Hill is no stranger to the Pirate football team after spending four seasons (1997-00) as Joe Taylor's offensive coordinator.

Last Meeting: Hampton 44, Morgan State 14 – Sept. 24, 2005 – Giants Stadium

Princeton Shepherd completed 9-of-15 passes for 186 yards and two touchdowns, while Alonzo Coleman rushed for 126 yards and two scores on just 11 carries as the Pirates amassed 576 yards of total offense. New Jersey native Dereck Faulkner had a career-day with five catches for 113 yards and his 38-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter gave the Pirates a 34-7 advantage. Defensively Justin Durant led Hampton with 10 tackles (8 solo) and Marcus Dixon pitched in with seven stops and a sack.

Last Time Out: Hampton 48, NC A&T 14 – Sept. 16, 2006 – Armstrong Stadium

Making his first career start in place of an injured Alonzo Coleman, Kevin Beverly ran for 204 yards and four touchdowns to lead the 10th ranked Pirates of Hampton University to a 48-14 victory over visiting North Carolina A&T. Beverly scored on runs of 4, 1, 6, and 9 yards, while the pirates rushed for six total touchdowns as a team. Quarterback Princeton Shepherd threw for 140 yards and a touchdown and ran for another. Defensively, Travarous Bain picked off two passes and broke up two more and Justin Durant led the Pirates 10 tackles. Hampton held NC A&T to just 210 total yards on the day.

In The Polls: Despite defeating North Carolina A&T 48-14 last Saturday, the Pirates fell one spot to No. 11 in both The Sports Network and The College Sporting News Coaches Polls. Hampton remains No. 1 in the SBN Sports Black College Football Poll, receiving all 30 first place votes.

Success vs. The Bears: The Morgan State defense has been a welcome sight for the Pirates over the past several years, evident by Hampton's 40 point average over the last four meetings. In fact the Pirates have scored at least 30 points in seven of their last eight games versus MSU.

HU Versus The MEAC: Since the 2003 season the Pirates have a conference record of 21-3, including 13 consecutive victories. Their last MEAC loss came with a 28-23 defeat at Delaware State back on Oct. 2, 2004.

Taylor In September: The Pirates are 48-9-1 (.828) in the month of September under Coach Taylor, including a mark of 14-0 in the last three years.

Maintaining Balance: Although the Pirates have switched to a more wide open offense, they still have managed to maintain the balance that has allowed them to be successful in recent years. Through the first three ball games Hampton has 128 rushing attempts to 85 passing attempts, but the total yardage is nearly the same with 736 coming on the ground and 654 through the air. The passing game has improved the most since a year ago, evident by

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the Pirates averaging 218 yards per game this season, as opposed to just 150 yards in 2005.

Pirate Offense Tops In I-AA: After putting up 405 yards of total offense last week against North Carolina A&T, the Pirates currently find themselves sitting atop the I-AA rankings in total offense. Hampton is averaging 463.3 yards of total offense and 40 points per game which ranks fifth. The Pirates are seventh in the country in rushing (245.33) and 22nd in passing (218.0) and averaging better than 6.5 yards per play.

HU Block Party: The three blocked kicks that the Pirates recorded during the season opener against Grambling may have been a surprise to some, but to those around the HU program it was just business as usual. In fact, since the 2003 season the Pirates have blocked a total of 23 field goals, extra points and punts. After blocking nine kicks in 2003, the Pirates registered six and five in the following two seasons and this year they already have three in just two games. Calvin Bannister leads Hampton with five blocks during this span and Kendall Langford ranks second with four.

249 And Counting: With 249 consecutive games without being shutout, Hampton currently leads I-AA in that category. The last time the Pirates were held scoreless was back on Sept. 1, 1984 when they fell to Tennessee State 44-0 in the season opener.

Coleman New HU Record Holder: Alonzo Coleman ran for 172 yards and three touchdowns in the Pirates' 46-7 win over Howard to establish three new marks in the Hampton University record books. With 3,840 rushing yards, 55 touchdowns and 330 points, Coleman is now the Pirates' all-time leader in all three categories, surpassing former HU standout Montrell Coley (1997-00). In addition, his 330 points also topped Coley for the MEAC's all-time scoring mark.

Mr. 4000 – With 3,840 career rushing yards, Alonzo Coleman is just 160 yards shy of joining the 4,000-yard club. If he can rush for 1,000 yards again this season he will become just the third player in Division I-AA history to have four consecutive 1,000-yard seasons, joining Jerry Azumah (New Hampshire, 95-98) and Adrian Peterson (Georgia Southern, 98-01). Harvard's Clifton Dawson and UMASS' Steve Baylark are also looking to accomplish this feat.

Beverly's Sets New Mark Against Aggies: Kevin Beverly's 204 yards rushing and four touchdowns against North Carolina A&T both established a new marks at Hampton for a player making his first career start. In addition, his four touchdown performance is also tied for the national lead in points in a single game this season with 24.

Shepherd Thriving Under New Offense: Despite having to adjust to a new offensive scheme, quarterback Princeton Shepherd has shown that he is indeed capable of being a drop back passer and keeping opposing defenses from keying on running back Alonzo Coleman. Through the first three games of the season Shepherd has completed 40-of-59 passes for 510 yards and four touchdowns to rank ninth in the country in passing efficiency with a rating of 159.4. In addition, his 67.8 completion percentage ranks eighth. Against North Carolina A&T Shepherd threw for 140 yards and a touchdown to improve to 24-5 as a starter.

Shepherd Back Under Center: Senior Princeton Shepherd is back for his third season as the starting quarterback and he's looking to join Matt Montgomery (1991-94) as the only Hampton signal caller to guide the Pirates to three consecutive conference titles. Shepherd

has a remarkable record of 24-5 as a starter, with four of those losses coming by a combined 25 points, and he has tossed at least one touchdown pass in 22 of those 29 games. With 3,876 yards passing for his career, Shepherd should overtake Tim Frazier (4,035) for third place on the Pirates' all-time passing list. Shepherd is also currently fifth all-time in pass completions (256), fourth in touchdown passes (35) and sixth in total offense (4,170), just 79 yards behind Frazier (4,249) in that category as well.

Paterini At It Again: After leading the nation in field goals last season, placekicker Andrew Paterini is on pace to repeat that task again in 2006. Through the first three weeks of the season he is tied for third in Division I-AA with six made field goals and is tied for fifth in field goals made per game at 2.00. He is also 12th in scoring with 31 points for an average of 10.33 points per game. Against Howard he connected on field goals of 27, 34, 26 and 22 yards to match his Hampton record for the third time with four made field goals in a game.

Return Game Near Top In I-AA: The Pirates' kickoff and punt returners have routinely been among the best in the country over the past several years, and this season appears to be no different. Sophomore Kevin Teel is currently ranked sixth in kickoff returns with an average of 32.7 yards following his two returns for 74-yards against NC A&T. His 73-yard effort against Howard was longer than any of the Pirates' kickoff returns in 2005 and the longest since Ardell Daniels brought one back 89 yards for a score against North Carolina A&T on Nov. 13, 2004. After finishing 12th in punt return average in 2005, Marquay McDaniel is currently ranked 18th with an average of 13.13 yards per return.

McDaniel Making History Of His Own: While running back Alonzo Coleman has garnered much of the attention for his record setting efforts, Marquay McDaniel has quietly become I-AA's all-time leader in punt returns. McDaniel entered the season ranked No. 1 in career punt return yards and he continues to add to his total which now stands at 1,773. In addition, with 124 career returns he is just 20 shy of overtaking former Montana return man Levander Segars (143) for the all-time lead in that category as well.

Durant Listed As Top 5 LB By Mel Kiper: The two-time MEAC Defensive Player of the Year Justin Durant has caught the eye of NFL draft guru Mel Kiper. Prior to the season Kiper rated his top five seniors at each position and Durant is ranked No. 4 at inside linebacker and he also has the distinction of being the only Division I-AA player among the 80 seniors listed.

Durant Climbs To Third All-Time In Total Tackles: With 10 tackles last week against North Carolina A&T, senior Justin Durant moved into third place all-time in the Hampton record books with 283 total tackles to his credit. His 124 tackles in 2005 were the fourth best total in a season by any Pirate defender and another stellar season should see him climb as high as No. 2 in career tackles, behind only Gareth Bonds' (1989-92) 389 career stops.

Bain Tied For National Lead: Senior cornerback Travarous Bain is currently among 16 players tied for first in Division I-AA with an average of 2.00 passes defended per game. After ranking fourth in that category in 2005, he has picked up where he left off with four pass breakups and two interceptions through the first three games.

HU Defense Continues Streak: With two interceptions by Travarous Bain last week, the Pirates extended their streak of consecutive games having forced a turnover. Hampton has forced its opponents into at least one turnover in each of the last 29 games. The last time the HU defense went without forcing a turnover was back on Nov. 8, 2003 at Bethune-

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Cookman.

Coleman and Durant Up For National Awards: Hampton linebacker Justin Durant has been tabbed by The Sports Network as one of the leading 16 candidates for the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually to the top defensive player in Division I-AA, while his teammate Alonzo Coleman is among the leading candidates for the Payton Award which goes to the best player on the offensive side of the ball.

Coleman and Daniels Made History In 2005: The running back tandem of Alonzo Coleman and Ardell Daniels ran for 1,326 and 1,044 yards respectively in 2005 to become just the third pair of backs to each rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons, after the duo also did it in 2004. After splitting time and carries for the past three years, Coleman is finally the focal point of the Pirates' ground game which should allow for him to add to his school record 21 100-yard games.

Pirate Trio Tops Among Active I-AA Players: Alonzo Coleman's 55 total touchdowns and his 53 rushing touchdowns rank first among active players in Division I-AA, as does his 3,840 rushing yards. Fellow Pirate senior Marquay McDaniel also leads all active players with 124 punt returns and 1,773 punt return yards. His 14.3 yard return average ranks third. With his 49 made field goals Andrew Paterini ranks second in that category, while his 296 points rank second behind his teammate Coleman (330).

HU Dominates Preseason All-MEAC Honors: When the preseason all-conference team was announced the Pirates not only landed a league-high nine players on it, but they also swept Player of the Year honors. Senior running back Alonzo Coleman was named the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year for the third consecutive season to lead five Pirates on the offensive side of the ball. The 2004 and 2005 MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, senior linebacker Justin Durant was again tabbed to walk away with the league's top defensive honor in 2006.

Pirates Picked To Repeat: The reigning Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) champion Hampton University was picked to capture its third consecutive conference title according to the media and coaches polls released at the MEAC Football Press Luncheon in Virginia Beach. In addition, the Pirates swept the Preseason Player of the Year honors and landed nine players on the Preseason All-MEAC Football Team.

The Pirates received 10 of 16 possible first place votes in the media poll and six of nine votes in the coaches' poll. South Carolina State was predicted to finish second in both polls, while Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M were predicted to place third in the media and coaches polls respectively.

Sports Network Positional Rankings: HU linebacker Justin Durant was ranked as the second best linebacker in the country according to a preseason poll distributed by The Sports Network. Defensive end Kendall Langford and cornerback Travarous Bain were ranked third and seventh at their positions respectively. On the offensive side of the ball Alonzo Coleman was tabbed as the seventh best running back and placekicker Andrew Paterini ranked fourth.

Old Faces In New Places: Several veterans are back but in different positions this season on both sides of the ball. Offensively, Antwan Smith who came into camp as the No. 2 quarterback has been moved to wide receiver. West Virginia transfer TJ Mitchell will now backup Princeton Shepherd. On defense, former defensive backs Henti Baird and Ray Lewis have moved down to linebacker. Both bring big hit abilities and Baird adds great athleticism which he displayed during preseason testing with a school record 41 inch vertical jump. Akeem Lamar has also made the switch from offensive line to defensive tackle where he should see plenty of action.

From Walk-On To Starter: Senior Jermaine Mallory is a testament to the fact that hard
